

GPW 13 is focused on impact





GPW 13 – major shifts

- ✓ Based on SDGs – to ensure healthy lives and promote wellbeing for all at all ages & leave no one behind
- ✓ Measures impact – “triple billion” goals and impact and accountability framework
- ✓ Sets priorities – advancing UHC, addressing health emergencies, promoting healthier populations
- ✓ Steps up leadership
- ✓ Drives impact in every country
- ✓ Strengthens normative work
- ✓ Transforms resource mobilization
- ✓ Confers a sense of urgency, scale, and quality

Major changes since Nov EBSS draft

Greater focus and prioritization: Under a chapeau of ensuring healthy lives and promoting wellbeing for all at all ages (i.e. SDG 3), GPW focuses on 3 priorities: UHC, health emergencies, and healthier populations, supported by 5 platforms: human capital, NCDs/mental health, elimination of CDs, AMR, climate.

More detail on implementation: Current draft has greater detail on implementation across all strategic priorities. Further details will come through operational plans as part of the Programme Budgeting process.


Core functions: The strategic shifts explicitly grounded in specific WHO core functions.

Normative vs Operational: Normative role emphasised more as it is the core of WHO's comparative advantage. The draft incorporates the clarity provided at EBSS on WHO's restricted operational role.

Polio transition: Addressed in the draft and also in recently released paper.

Many other more detailed changes have been made.

GPW 13 has a measureable “Triple billion” goal



Universal health coverage

1 billion more people benefitting from UHC

Fully aligned with SDG 3.8: achieving UHC, including financial risk protection, access to quality essential health care services and safe, effective, quality and affordable essential medicines and vaccines for all.

Focus: strong, resilient, people-centred health systems with primary care

Elements: Service access & quality; Health workforce; Access to medicines, vaccines and health products; Governance and finance; Health information systems; Advocacy; Country support.

Approach: Review & build upon existing UHC road maps, national health sector plans, and regional frameworks. Support countries to develop their own national packages of essential health services.

Health emergencies

1 billion more people better protected from health emergencies

Goals:

- build and sustain resilient national, regional and global capacities required to keep the world safe from epidemics and other health emergencies; and
- ensure that populations affected by acute and protracted emergencies have rapid access to essential life-saving health services including health promotion and disease prevention.

All hazards approach

Closely linked to health systems strengthening

Serve the most vulnerable in fragile and conflict affected countries

Healthier populations

1 billion more people enjoying better health and wellbeing

Five Platforms which serve this and the other goals:

1. Improving Human Capital across the life course
2. Accelerating action on preventing Non-communicable diseases and promoting mental health
3. Accelerating elimination and eradication of high impact communicable diseases
4. Tackling anti-microbial resistance
5. Addressing health effects of climate change in small island developing states and other vulnerable settings

Strategic shifts

= ways of working = how WHO will deliver

3. **Focusing global public goods on impact**


